On Friday (29th August, 1947) at 10 a.m. the four sanitation workers, Hershkovitz, Horowitz, Ifrach and Backaliash, left the camp, as usual, on the salvage truck, carrying the garbage out of the camp. When the truck reached the cheek post of the M.P., it was stopped, the escort which usually accompanies the truck was returned and the workers were told to get out of the truck and were brought into the hut of the M.P. After 15 minutes of telephonic conversations they turned to the people, took of f their shoes and started beating them.

then two other soldiers attached the workers and beat them. In a state of half-consciousness the men were thrown out of the hut, beaten again by the M.P. and loaded on the truck where their usual escort and other two soldiers waited. Three of the men completely lost their consciousness on the truck. At the salvage dump they met the salvage gruck from camp 61 and the workers of this truck, as well as the Cypriet driver, noticed the state in which the men were. There were also there the escort of the truck from 61 camp and some Cyprict workers. The men were unable to see who emptied their truck. They were brought back to the check post, where they were washed and led again to the same hut. Then the truck from Camp 55 arrived and waited until 12 o'clock. One of the workers received an attack of epilepsys. The workers were put on the truck by the M.P. and carried to the C.R.S.

At the entrance to the C.R.S. they were met by other M.P.s; no one of the medical workers attended to them. After consultation with the M.P., the military doctor get on the bruck, shouting at the men that they were simulants, without even looking at them. He then beat Backaliash on the face and used other brutal means to wake him. He pulled Hershkovitz by the hair; none of the men moved. Four soldiers took Hershkovitz off the bruck (without a stretcher). Then the ill people staying in the C.R.S. reacted against this, they were dispersed. Hershkovitz was then thrown back on the truck and the doctor had another consultation which lasted 15 minutes, after which the truck with the men was sent back to the M.P. station, where they were once more brought into the hut, where the soldiers tried to clean the blood on the floor. The beaten men asked for mater, but were refused it.

At 3 p.m. the Captain of Camp 55 came and took the men back to the camp, accompanied by the MXP mocking M.P. In the evening the doctor sent them to the C.R.S., but they were returned without having been examined by the doctor. Their clothing is completely term. They are at the moment in a serious cendition.
